"The women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples.
Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said.
They came to him, clasped his feet and worshipped him.
Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid.
Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.
Matthew 28:8-10, NIV

From Genesis right through to Revelation, we encounter God telling us to "fear not". But fear is real. It's a natural emotion we experience in times of uncertainty and despair.

Imagine how Jesus' mother, disciples, friends and followers might have felt while witnessing his final moments on the Cross. Crushed? Lonely? Scared? They have seen their son, friend and teacher reject old laws, protest against injustice and inequality, teach true compassion and live a compelling life of truth and love. He had healed the broken, protected the innocent, forgiven the judged, restored humanity and reintegrated the overlooked into the community. He has radically spun society on its head. And now he is dead.

So, on the third day when Mary Magdalene and the women find Jesus' tomb empty, it's no wonder they feel anxious and unnerved, unsure of what is happening.

But these women remind us what to do in the face of fear — they fall at Jesus' feet and worship him. These women are afraid, but they also respond to Jesus with joy, and hope that dares to trust beyond belief.

The Easter narrative is full of ups and downs, light and dark, hope and despair. Yet the end of the story is emphatic — here is hope and joy, and here is Jesus telling his friends and followers to not be afraid. In a world still full of turmoil, we are called to be people of deep and profound hope. "Do not abandon yourselves to despair" said John Paul II, "we are an Easter people and hallelujah is our song."

1–7 April Investigate Easter

Last month primary schools' development worker, Alison, held a series of themed Easter events called Investigate Easter, for 7–11 year olds. Visiting a total of 800 pupils across seven schools in Staffordshire, Alison shared 500 copies of Lifewords resource *Witness: Easter Voices*.

- The Investigate Easter project had detective-themed events and problem-solving
 activities, including coded tasks, spies and crime scenes. The students were given
 clues and evidence based on various scenes from the Easter story, which they had to
 investigate and evaluate before presenting their case. Give thanks for Alison and her
 team, and others like them, who work with children and young people, using creative
 ways to engage them with the Bible.
- "We encourage the children to explore their own thoughts as well as the opinions of their classmates," says Alison, "so Witness: Easter Voices fitted in perfectly. It's great being able to offer a resource that considers and presents multiple perspectives in a story." Please pray that each student who took a copy of Witness: Easter Voices, might feel encouraged to read the resource, ask questions and continue discovering a life and relationship with Jesus.
- Alison is a member of Youth Net a UK charity that networks, resources and inspires local schools and churches. They work to help young people reach their full potential and impact their generation by offering spiritual, emotional, educational and social support. 8–14 April Life words in your pocket

More than three billion people worldwide now have access to the internet. For almost 15 years Lifewords has been resourcing communities with Life Changing Words (LCWords) — a free email service and mobile app that sends daily Bible verses straight to users' devices, in 12 different global languages.

LCWords already has tens of thousands of global users, and last year almost 27,000 verses were shared by email, social media, or text message to a friend. Give thanks for the ways in which mobile devices are being used as pastoral and evangelistic tools, especially in times where people may not have a physical Bible resource to hand.

- We would now like to further develop LCWords and update its digital content. This
 includes uploading digital versions of our Bible resources to the app, allowing users
 to read them online and share them with friends and family. As well as reading and
 passing on daily verses, we want people to be able to share a message of depth and
 value, tailored to people's needs communicated through both text and image.
 Please pray that this new content will bring good news to many.
- At the same time, we plan to re-design some of our core range of literature to ensure
 the booklets stay fresh, relevant and up-to-date. We hope to be able to commit in
 the region of £50,000 to this work in 2018 on top of our regular budget for
 distributing Bible resources around the world free of charge. Give thanks for those
 who are able to support Lifewords' work through prayer and gifts. Please pray that
 we are able to meet our target and can equip more people with life words for
 themselves and their community.

15–21 April Choose Life: four years on

In 2014 Lifewords Kenya met Nancy – a high school student at Nyumbani children's home. During her time at school she attended Choose Life evening classes taught by Lifewords volunteer Jane Wamaitha. Here is Nancy's story:

- With 1.6 million people living with HIV, Kenya is one of the most HIV-affected countries in the world. Even though awareness is high, many fear the stigma and discrimination the condition still carries so decide not to seek support. This was the case for Nancy. Although Nyumbani Children's Home specialises in providing care to HIV-positive children, Nancy chose not to disclose to friends or at school that she was taking regular medication, and eventually stopped taking it as prescribed. Please pray for children and adults worldwide like Nancy, who might be living with HIV in silence.
- Choose Life is an interactive classroom programme designed to help young people develop decision-making skills and values for life, based on the Bible's wisdom. "After the first few sessions Nancy told me she had made the choice to start taking the HIV medication again," says Jane. "From then her health improved, she was able to focus in class, and graduate from high school." Praise God for the impact of Choose Life in building character and empowering young people with the ability to make the best choices for their lives and their community.
- Nancy has since gone on to take courses in photography, videography, and music production. "She is chasing her dreams and achieving so much," says Jane. "Now when I speak to her, she's able to talk about her life issues without the pain and bitterness. Nancy always talks about Choose Life to those she meets and says it has helped her face any dilemma she's going through." Give thanks for the Bible's life words that are transforming the hearts and minds of young people through Choose Life.
